39	The River Heights City Council met during a special meeting at 5:00 p.m. in the Ervin R. Crosbie Council Chambers in the River Heights City Building on Thursday, May 15, 2014. In the		
40	absence of Mayor Brackner, Councilmember Wright acted as mayor pro tem.		
41	Adoption of the Tentative 2014-2015 Budget: Mayor pro-tem Wright asked for any changes to		
42	the updated 2014-15 budget draft and/or the 2013-14 amendments. The budget total for 2013-14 was		
43	\$1,434,225 (income) and \$1,386,627 (expenses). The total for the 2014-15 budget was \$1,362,925		
44	(revenue) and \$1,148,155 (expenses). These figures include the General Fund, Capital Improvements,		
45	Water Fund and Sewer Fund.		

Councilmember Okelberry moved to "adopt the Tentative 2014-15 Budget in the amount of \$1,362,925". Councilmember Clausen seconded the motion, which carried with Clausen, Okelberry, Smith, Wilson and Wright in favor. No one opposed.

<u>Discuss the Possibility of Lowering Residential Property Taxes:</u> Councilmember Wright said Mayor Brackner has a call in to the Cache County Auditor to find out if the city needs to hold a tax hearing to lower taxes. Since they don't have a firm answer yet, this item will be discussed again at the next meeting. Meanwhile, the 2014-15 budget incorporates the rate reduction.

Adoption of an Ordinance to Establish a Temporary Land Use Regulation Regarding Residential Subdivisions within the City: Councilmember Wright reminded that a few months ago Mayor Brackner and PWD Nelson asked him to have the Commission recommend an amendment to the City Code that would require subdividers to provide a seal coat on their roads one year to 18 months after they install their roads. The Commission is going to need a little more time on this. Dan Hogan will soon be in to apply for his next subdivision phases, which the city desires to fall under the new road requirement. Therefore, he is requesting the Council adopt an ordinance that would prohibit subdivision approval for not more than six months. Although, it is Mr. Wright's intent to have the amendment back to the Council for adoption with one to two months.

Councilmember Wright read the ordinance. He doesn't see any reason to have the Commission hold off discussing subdivisions, just on the approval.

Dan Hogan asked if the city will require chip sealing or a sealant. Councilmember Wright isn't sure and will have the Commission look into it. Mr. Hogan asked if this will apply to everyone who installs a road in the city, including the city. Mr. Wright answered will apply to anyone doing a subdivision. Councilmember Okelberry suggested using wording that requires subdividers will follow the city's current road standard. Mr. Hogan prefers a sealant over chip/seal because it sticks better. Mr. Wright assured the Commission will have discussions about this with public works, the city engineer and others before wording the ordinance.

Councilmember Clausen moved "to approve Ordinance 2-2014, An Ordinance Establishing a Temporary Land Use Regulation Regarding Subdivisions Temporarily Prohibiting Subdivision Approval Within the Municipality Under Title 11 of the River Heights City Code." Councilmember Okelberry seconded the motion, which carried with Clausen, Okelberry, Smith, Wilson and Wright in favor. No one opposed.
