



OFFICIAL PUBLIC NOTICE OF 2024 PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION

The 2024 Presidential Election will be held on Tuesday, November 5, 2024. Ballots will be mailed out to eligible voters starting October 15, 2024. Voters must be of legal voting age, citizens of the United States, and reside in the precinct in which they are registered.

Voters can verify registration status and view a sample ballot online at www.vote.utah.gov. Registered voters who do not receive their ballot by October 24 should contact the Cache County Elections Office at 435-755-1460.

The voter registration deadline to receive a ballot in the mail is October 29 at 5:00 pm.

In-person early voting will be held October 29 – November 1 from 10:00 am – 4:00 pm at the Cache County Administration building, 179 North Main Street, Logan, Utah 84321.

In-person voting on Election Day will be held November 5, 2024, from 7:00 am – 8:00 pm at the Cache County Event Center (Fairgrounds), 490 South 500 West, Logan, Utah 84321.

There are 21 ballot drop boxes conveniently located throughout the valley, including city offices, the Cache County administration building parking lot, and on campus at Utah State University. Historically, turnout for Presidential General Elections in Cache County is significantly higher. Please plan to vote early. All mail must be postmarked November 4, 2024.

A public logic and accuracy test will be held on Friday, October 11, 2024, at 10:00 am. This tests voting systems that will be used for the 2024 Presidential Election. An audit of the 2024 Presidential Election will be held on November 12, 2024, at 10:00 am. Both of these events will be held at the Cache County Ballot Processing Center:

Proposed Constitutional Amendments

Constitutional Amendment A

Shall the Utah Constitution be amended to allow income tax money to be used for all state needs and prioritize public education funding for changes in enrollment and inflation? If this amendment is approved, state statute will eliminate the state sales tax on food.

- Allow Utah citizens 50% more time to gather signatures for a statewide referendum.
- Establish requirements for the legislature to follow the intent of a ballot initiative.
