Business Licenses

If you are running a business out of your home, you need to apply for a license.

The timeframe for renewals on previously registered businesses is Nov 1 through Dec 31. After the deadline, there is a \$30 late fee. The application can be found at riverheights.org under 'Forms.'

It is your responsibility to maintain the landscaping adjacent to the street in the front, sides and rear of your property. This includes cutting back all growth hanging into the road and over the sidewalks. Thank you.

Water Meter Accessibility

The city needs 24/7 access to all water meters and requires the following:

"Customer shall keep and maintain utility service meters and equipment free of barriers (includes fences and walls), animals and vegetation within a 4 foot radius." Fines can be imposed for non-compliance.

Winter Parking Restrictions

Don't forget, it is unlawful to park any vehicle on any public street from November 15 - March 15 between the hours of 4:00 am and 12:00 noon.

Stormwater Protection

Salt or alternative de-icing chemicals are used in winter maintenance to melt snow and ice to ensure pedestrian safety. When snow and ice melt, the water becomes stormwater runoff, which ends up in our streams, rivers and lakes. As the runoff moves over paved surfaces, it collects sand, salt and other pollutants and deposits them into surface water causing contamination.

When using de-icers, follow product directions carefully to reduce the amount used and choose environmentally preferable de-icing products to reduce your impact on our water system.
