Dog Licenses Due before March 1

It's time to renew your dog's license. Please bring paperwork showing proof of rabies to the City Office. The fees are \$15 for dogs spayed or neutered, and \$25 otherwise.

If you are unable to come in during office hours you can drop a copy of the proof of rabies, along with the appropriate fee in the drop box. If you have more than 2 dogs you will need to apply for a kennel license.

A late fee of \$10/month applies each month after February 29.

Winter Parking Restrictions

No parking is allowed of vehicles, trailers, or any other obstructions on the street beginning November 15 through March 15, between the hours of **4:00 am and 12:00 noon**. Violators will be cited.

Memorial Plaques at Stewart Hill Park

Early planning and public hearings for the creation of Stewart Hill Park considered possible cemetery features. The park borders the Providence Cemetery and the park currently includes a memorial garden area.

Therefore, if residents living in River Heights or surrounding areas would like to dedicate and place a granite memorial in front of a tree or bench, in commemoration of a loved one please contact River Heights City Office for cost and details.

There are approximately 25 trees already planted that are available and approximately 6 sites for bench placement.

Park Donations

The city is also seeking donations to help fund the park. River Heights has received about half the funding for Stewart Hill Park from RAPZ. RAPZ has also generously funded other projects in the City. Currently we are seeking grants through the Utah Division of Outdoor Recreation to cover the cost of a pavilion and, eventually, a restroom at Stewart Hill Park. All of the grants have a match requirement of about 50% of project cost. Please consider a donation to River Heights to help receive grant funding for these projects. If you would like to make a donation and/or have a commemoration plaque placed by a tree, bench or pavilion in someone's honor please contact the River Heights City Office for details.
